While in Bartlesville you'll enjoy an authentic Native American meal and style show with the Bartlesville Indian Women's Club. They will serve traditional food along with a demonstration of some of their traditional attire. On our way home, we'll stop at the beautiful restored Coleman Theatre in Miami, Oklahoma for a tour and lunch.
