TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5 (DINNER)

Join us on a fun-filled adventure as we explore Kentucky's history, horses, and heritage! Our tour begins as we make our way to **Louisville**, a charming city that was founded in 1778 and named after King Louis XVI of France. We'll check into the conveniently located **Holiday Inn Express Downtown Louisville** for two nights. We will enjoy **dinner** at a popular local restaurant.

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 6 (BREAKFAST, LUNCH)

We start with a home run today as we visit the **Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory**, where it's all about celebrating the
extraordinary role of the Louisville Slugger bat in baseball's past,
present, and future. Legend has it that the first pro bat created here
in 1884 was for Pete Browning, who would become known as "The
Louisville Slugger." America's favorite pastime connects us all, and
together we'll enjoy this interesting **factory tour and museum**,
where everyone receives a miniature souvenir baseball bat!

Next it's off to the **Kentucky Derby Museum**, where we explore the race's long history dating back to 1875. Two floors of interactive exhibits take visitors through every stage of a Thoroughbred's life, from birth to the Derby. We will also learn about past and current champions and experience all the traditions that have transformed the Derby into "The Greatest Race."





We are in for a treat at **Churchill Downs' Millionaires Row,** where we'll have great seating for an afternoon of Thoroughbred racing! After enjoying a bountiful **lunch buffet**, check your program and place your bets for the exciting races. After the last horses cross the finish line, we'll all return to our hotel as winners after this amazing day!

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 7 (BREAKFAST, DINNER)

Depart this morning for the incredible **Ark Encounter**, featuring a full-size Noah's Ark that was built according to the dimensions given in the Bible. This marvel is seven stories tall and one-and-a-half football fields long! Have you ever wondered how Noah fed and cared for all the animals? How Noah built the Ark? You'll find the answers in the world-class exhibits that allow you to experience what Noah's life may have been like.

Next we'll travel to **Old Friends**, a "living history museum" of horse racing. Old Friends provides a dignified retirement to Thoroughbreds whose racing and breeding careers have come to an end. Get up close and personal with racing's superstars while also meeting a few who never saw the inside of a winner's circle.





After a full afternoon, we arrive in **Berea, Kentucky** and check into the lovely **Historic Boone Tavern Hotel.** Established in 1909, this property exudes Southern elegance and hospitality. A delicious **dinner** is included this evening at the hotel.

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 8 (BREAKFAST, DINNER)

Enjoy a full breakfast at the hotel before we check out and begin our day with a walking tour of **Berea College**, a private liberal arts work college founded in 1855. During our tour, we'll learn how this college is distinctive among post-secondary institutions for providing free education to students and for having been the first college in the Southern United States to be coeducational and racially integrated.

Next, we'll tour and taste at the **Maker's Mark Distillery**, where they make fine whiskey the same way they did when they opened in 1953.

After the tour we're on our way to **Bardstown**, a charming town that officially starts the **Kentucky Bourbon Trail**. We'll check into **Holiday Inn Express & Suites Bardstown** for one night. This town is a great place to be immersed in all things' bourbon - history, culture, and tasting Kentucky-made whiskey. We'll have a delicious **dinner** in the historic **Old Talbott Tavern**. Built in 1779, a year before the settlement of Bardstown began, this tavern is considered the "oldest Western stagecoach stop" still in operation.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 9 (BREAKFAST, LUNCH)

It's time to head home, but the fun is not over yet! Along the way, we'll stop in **Grand Rivers, KY**, at **Patti's 1880's Settlement** for a delicious **lunch** complete with one of their famous, fresh-made desserts. We will have time to browse the settlement's many shops before departing.

We'll return home this evening with a captivating appreciation for Kentucky's history, horses, and heritage after this blue-ribbon tour!
